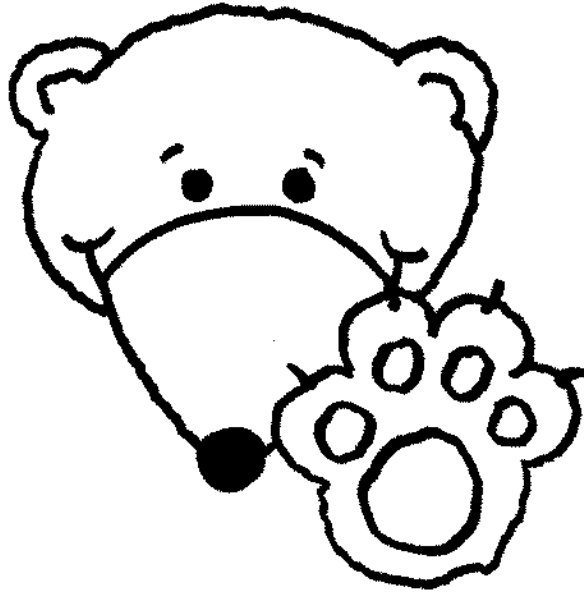

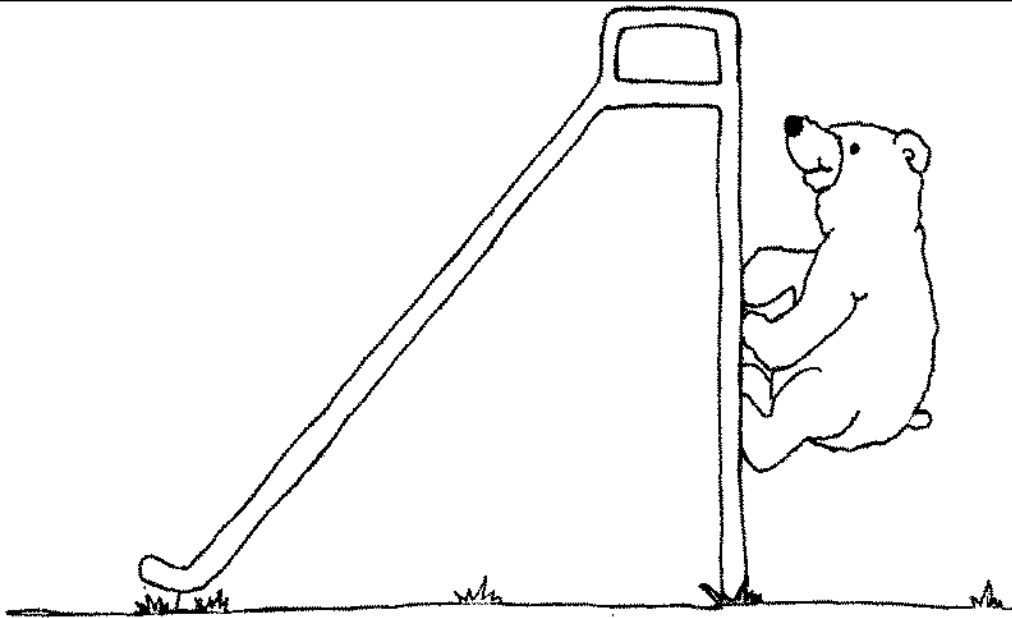

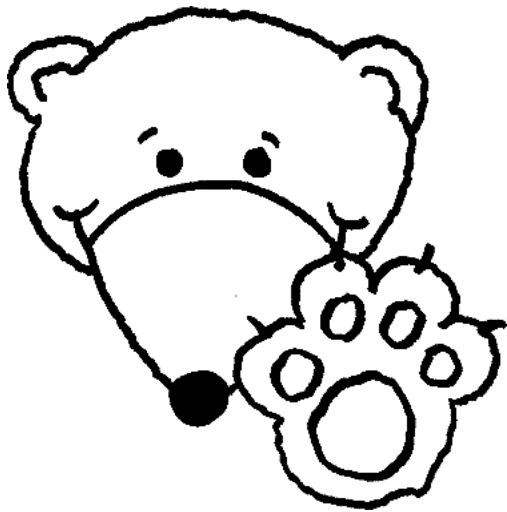

A “Paws”itively Yummy Snack!

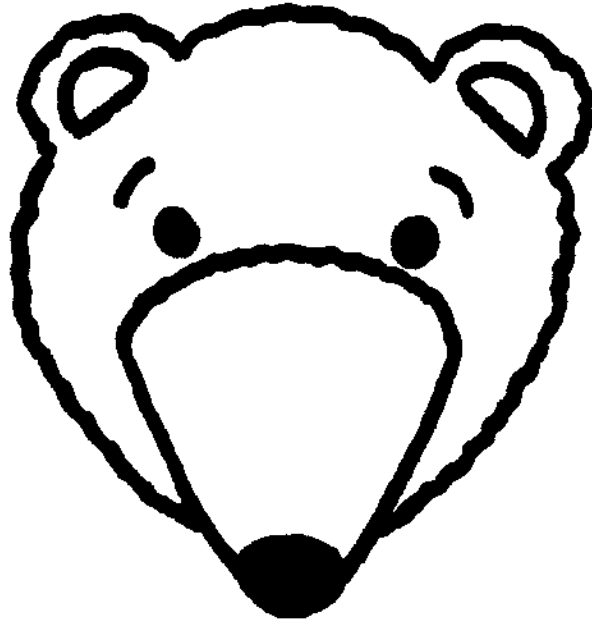
Want a yummy bear treat? These bear paws are easy to make, and the kids love them!!

You will need:

1 can of biscuits
½ cup of brown sugar
½ stick of butter, melted
1 package of almond slivers (you can use rice noodles if you have a child who is allergic to nuts)

1. Preheat oven as directed on biscuit package.
2. Place melted butter in a bowl, and brown sugar on a plate.
3. Take each biscuit, one at a time, and dip the top ½ in the melted butter, then press into the brown sugar until top surface is coated.
4. Place biscuits on an ungreased cookie sheet about 2” apart with the sugared side up and bake as directed on the package.
5. After removing biscuits from the oven, poke 4 almond slivers into the side of the biscuit, creating claws. *You can place the “claws” in the paw prior to baking; they will sink into the paw and will brown. I prefer to put them in when the biscuits are still warm, they seem to stick better that way.*
6. Enjoy!
